- Consult with and respond to inquiries from JCOPE concerning development of NYLB compliance programs and potential compliance violations.
- Manage the NYLB's internal controls, including requesting and reviewing divisional quarterly internal control certifications.
- Develop and implement general monitoring procedures to detect violations of policies and procedures.
- Monitor legislative and regulatory developments to advise and update compliance programming.
- Work with management on strategic planning activities and risk mitigation to enhance NYLB's compliance programming.
- Performing additional related task and duties as requested.
