

ORDERED, that the Ancillary Receiver shall give notice of the Claim Filing
Deadline and Contingent Claim Deadline to all creditors, claimants and interested persons
located in the State of New York by: (a) serving a copy the proposed notice ("Notice") by first
class mail to those parties that objected to the Superintendent's application for an order of
ancillary receivership; (b) publishing the Notice in Business Insurance, or a publication of
similar circulation, once a week for two consecutive publications, commencing within four
weeks of entry of this Order; and (c) posting the Notice on the Internet web page maintained by
the NYLB at <http://nylb.org> within ten (10) days of entry of this Order.
