ORDER AND JUSTIMENT

COLONIAL INDEMNITY INSURANCE COMPANY.

Scott D. Fischer, Acting Special Deputy Superintendent and agent of the Superintendent of Financial Services of the State of New York as liquidator ("Liquidator") of Colonial Indemnity Insurance Company ("Colonial"), having moved this Court for an order: (i) approving the Liquidator's report on the status of and request to close ("Closing Report") the Colonial liquidation proceeding ("Liquidation Proceeding") and the financial transactions delineated in such report; (ii) authorizing the continued payment of administrative expenses, including such expenses pertaining to the closing of the Liquidation Proceeding; (iii) terminating and closing the Liquidation Proceeding; (iv) authorizing the Liquidator, without further order of this Court, to receive and disburse assets of Colonial after the termination of the Liquidation Proceeding and to use such assets, first to pay administrative expenses incurred in connection with the collection and disbursement of such additional assets, and then to distribute the balance of such assets to those creditors of Colonial with allowed claims who are eligible to share in a *pro-rata* distribution; (v) approving the Liquidator's recommendation to allow the claim of the New York Property/Casualty Insurance Security Fund ("PC Fund") for expenses and losses it

paid, totaling \$24,627.16; (vi) releasing and discharging the Liquidator, his predecessors and successors in office, and their agents, attorneys and employees, from any and all liability arising from their acts or omissions in connection with the Liquidation Proceeding; (vii) authorizing and directing the Liquidator, in his discretion, to destroy or otherwise dispose of any and all of the books, files, records and other property of Colonial without further order of this Court; and (viii) providing for such other and further relief as this Court deems appropriate and just.

NOW, upon reading the Verified Petition, dated October 16, 2014, due proof of service thereof upon all parties interested in Colonial, and due deliberation having been had thereon, and upon the decision of this Court;

NOW, on application of John Pearson Kelly, attorney for the Liquidator, it is ORDERED, that the application is granted; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Closing Report on the status of and request to close the Liquidation Proceeding and financial transactions delineated such Closing Report are approved; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator is granted the continued authority to pay administrative expenses, including such expenses pertaining to the closing of the Liquidation Proceeding; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidation Proceeding is terminated and closed; and it if further ORDERED, that the Liquidator is authorized, without further application to this Court, to receive and disburse assets of Colonial after the termination of the Liquidation Proceeding and to use such assets, first to pay administrative expenses incurred in connection with the collection and disbursement of such additional assets, and then to distribute the balance of such assets to

those creditors of Colonial with allowed claims who are eligible to share in a *pro-rata* distribution; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator's recommendation to allow the claim PC Fund for expenses and losses it paid, totaling \$24,627.16 is approved;

ORDERED, that the Liquidator, his predecessors and successors in office, and their agents, attorneys and employees, are released and discharged from any and all liability arising from their acts or omissions in connection with the Liquidation Proceeding; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator, in his discretion, is authorized and directed to destroy or otherwise dispose of any and all of the books, files, records and other property of Colonial without further order of this Court.
