Jonathan L. Bing, Special Deputy Superintendent and agent of the Superintendent of Financial Services of the State of New York ("Superintendent") as liquidator ("Liquidator") of Contractors Casualty and Surety Company ("CCSC"), having moved this Court, pursuant to Article 74 of the New York Insurance Law ("Insurance Law"), for an order: (i) approving the Liquidator's initial report on the status of the liquidation of CCSC ("Initial Report") and the financial transactions delineated therein: (ii) authorizing the continued payment of administrative costs and expenses; (iii) authorizing the Liquidator to distribute CCSC's assets, consistent with this Court's orders and the priorities set forth in Insurance Law Section 7434, to those creditors of CCSC with allowed claims, to the extent that, in the Liquidator's discretion, sufficient funds are available; (iv) extending immunity to the Superintendent in his capacity as Liquidator of CCSC, and his successors in office and their agents and employees, for any cause of action of any nature against them, individually or jointly, for any act or omission when acting in good faith, in accordance with the orders of this Court, or in the performance of their duties pursuant to Insurance Law Article 74; and (v) granting such other and further relief as this Court decms appropriate and just.

NOW, upon reading the Verified Petition, dated October 13, 2011, due proof of service thereof upon all parties interested in CCSC, and due deliberation having been had thereon, and upon the decision of this Court;

NOW, on application of John Pearson Kelly, attorney for the Liquidator, it is

ORDERED, that the application is granted; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Initial Report and financial transactions delincated therein are approved; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator is authorized to continue paying administrative costs and expenses; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Liquidator is authorized to distribute CCSC's assets, consistent with this Court's orders and the priorities set forth in Insurance Law Section 7434, to those creditors of CCSC with allowed claims to the extent that, in the Liquidator's discretion, sufficient funds are available; and it is further

ORDERED, that immunity is extended to the Superintendent in his capacity as Liquidator of CCSC, and his successors in office and their agents and employees, for any cause of action of any nature against them, individually or jointly, for any act or omission when acting in good faith, in accordance with the orders of this Court, or in the performance of their duties pursuant to Insurance Law Article 74.
